**THOUGHT:** Remember that when you leave this earth, you can take nothing you have received...but only what you have given; a full heart enriched by honest service, love, sacrifice and courage.

Do you ever fret over the question of whether or not you have enough—enough money, enough time, enough strength, enough patience? When I worry about such things, it's usually because I've misplaced my trust. Take money, for example: If I'm trusting in my IRA or my pension to provide for my needs and then the economy falters or the stock market takes a plunge, of course I have reason to worry. Jesus warned that wealth is deceitful . It

cannot be trusted. Likewise, jobs come and go. And so we worry.

The error lies in thinking that our source of income is our security. Not so! God alone is our provider. God is the one who gives us the opportunity and ability to earn a living. And if the job disappears or we become unable to work, God is undaunted. He will provide for his children through other means. When we trust in God we can be certain that there will always be enough.

I wonder if the better question is not whether we have or will have enough, but whether we are giving

enough. Most of us have been blessed with far more than financial resources — even though our mobility may be more limited than in the past. Health, education, gifts, talents, time, community —we often think of these blessing, but they are also valuable resources. Maybe we should ask ourselves whether we are using

what God had given us wisely in the service of others. Are we giving enough?
